FTU WOMEN'S WING DIVISIONAL WORKSHOPS

The FTU National Women's Wing has organized a series of workshops for the women members in the branches. It is pleasing to note that more women members are professionally developing themselves and taking up positions in branches. FTU is encouraging and providing opportunities for women members to develop and gain exposure in Union matters. Two Divisional Workshops were conducted, one in Ba (Nadroga-Rakiraki) and the other in Rewa (Navua-Tailevu).

TEACHING OF VERNACULAR

The teaching of Vernacular has been made compulsory as per Constitution. Whilst this move laudable, the Union noted with concern that effective teaching and learning was not taking place because the Ministry was not able to post teachers for the above. FTU has asked the Ministry to seek additional funding and post vernacular teachers in schools so that effective teaching can take place.

TEACHER / PUPIL RATIO IN ALL SCHOOLS

In February 2014, the Ministry invited the Union for a consultative meeting to look at the possibility of reducing the teacher / pupil ratio. The Union had fought hard and had this included in the Job Evaluation Review [JER] of 1997. The Ministry has acknowledged that we have over-crowded classrooms with teacher /pupil ratio ranging from 1:40 to 1:50. The Ministry is now working on a proposal to reduce the ratio by increasing the establishment in Primary and Secondary schools by 900 and 400 respectively. A submission was also made that Executive Teacher positions be restored and non teaching for school Heads in grades ED 3C, 2C and 1B.

PUBLICITY MATTERS

The February issue of the Newsletter was sent to all the school reps in the first week. Branches must keep their membership informed of current issues by sending regular Branch Newsletters. Branch Secretaries are advised to send a copy of their branch newsletter to the HQ. The 2014 year planner was also sent to the Branches in early February for distribution to the members. If you have not received year planner then get in touch with your branch executives. The Conference Journal is presently being put into shape and the Publicity Committee would like to thank those who have contributed articles towards the 2014 Journal.

CTCL NEWS

- 1) Operating FTU-CTCL net profit is expected to be in excess of \$1.2 million.
- 2) Dividend for 2013 would be 4%.
- 3) In-House Mortgage Scheme (IMPS) has been reduced to 0.5% from 1.0%.
- 4) Hideaway Dividend for 2013 is 10%.
- 5) Vuda- Hideaway Resort construction is progressing well.

MOE CIRCULAR DUTY HOURS

The above circular left teachers in a dilemma as to whether they have to extend departure time to 4.30pm or adjust their timetable to accommodate the teaching of conversational Hindi and i-Taukei language. The GS wrote to PS MoE and then met with him to seek clarification. The PS advised that the timetable in the circular was a mere suggestion. He said the Heads of schools with their team could include the vernacular programme within their 8.00-3.30 timetable. School Heads are advised to note this and maintain the 8am to 3.30pm school day. The Union has also made it clear that teachers are on duty during lunch hour, hence the 3.30pm departure time.
