INSURANCE - CORRIGENDA

The November 2013 issue of the Newsletter under Medical Insurance read

" If members decide to have the treatment at a Private Clinic, whilst the treatment is available at the Government Hospital, 75% of the of the private clinic cost or \$4,500, whichever is less, will be reimbursed. Previously, it was 50% or \$3,500.

<u>The rule, under additional benefit</u> is;

" In the case where a member needs a medical treatment covered under the FTU self-funded medical programme, <u>and has</u> <u>been put on waiting list at a Public</u> <u>Hospital</u>, then a medical treatment at Private clinic as an option will be available subject to the following provision.

The maximum payable will be 75% of the private clinic cost or \$4,500 whichever is lesser. In the case where the equivalent treatment cost at Public Hospital is higher than amount payable under this provision, then the maximum payable will be equivalent cost at the Public Hospital.

CHANGE OF BRANCH

Members who have changed districts are to notify the Secretariat immediately so that the membership records could be updated.

The Union has also been seeking better terms and conditions of work for the ECE teachers from day one.
